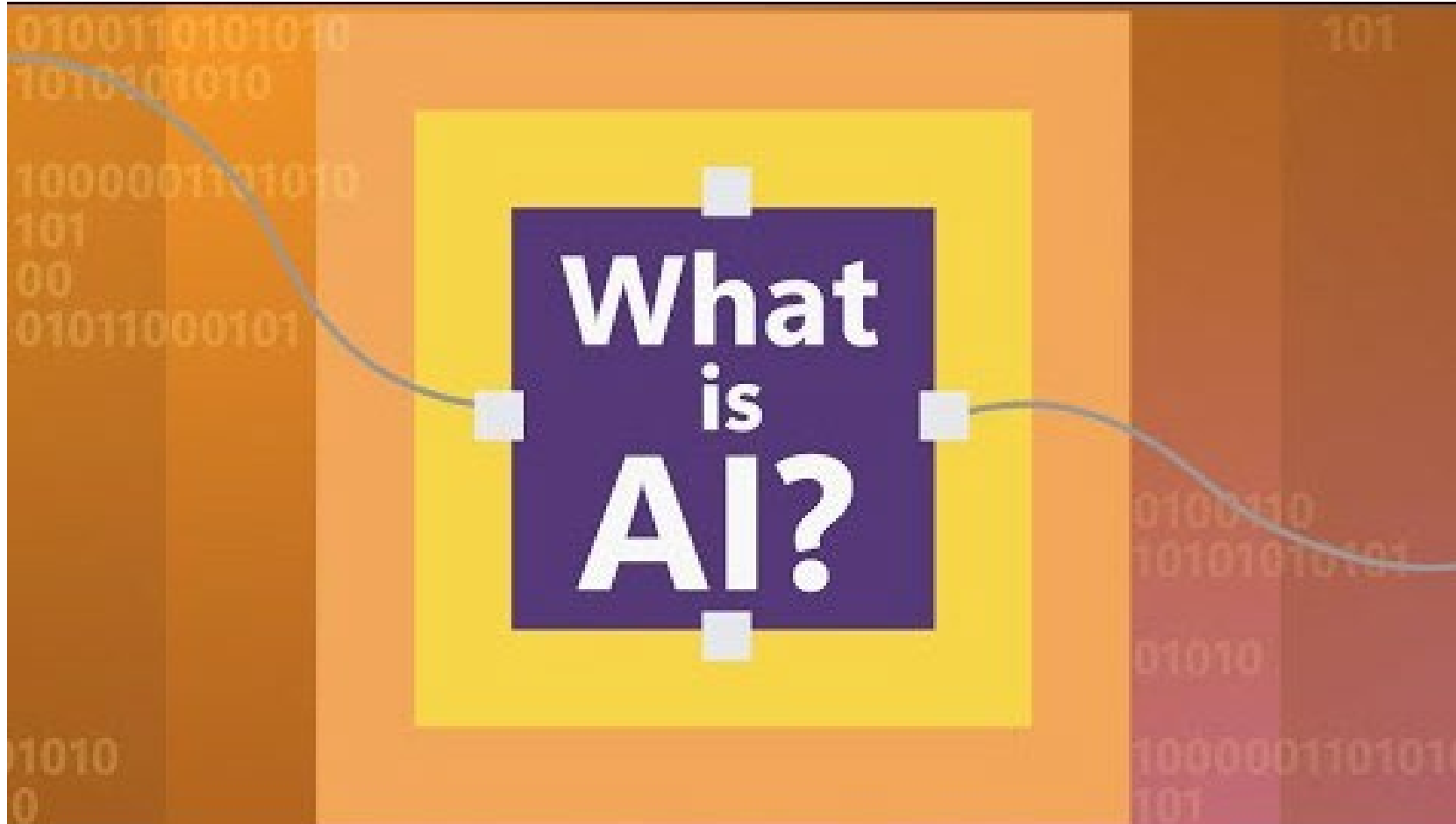
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# What is AI?

# How Can AI Help Us? – Drafting Emails, Letters

### 4. Continuing Education:

- Teachers and instructors must submit proof of completion of 15 hours of continuing education for renewal of certificates<sup>1</sup>.

### 5. Trichology Training Requirements:

- Trichology training must be completed at postsecondary educational institutions approved by the Nonpublic Postsecondary Education Commission (NPEC) or the board<sup>1</sup>.
- Existing teachers or instructors must complete trichology training before renewing their certification<sup>1</sup>.

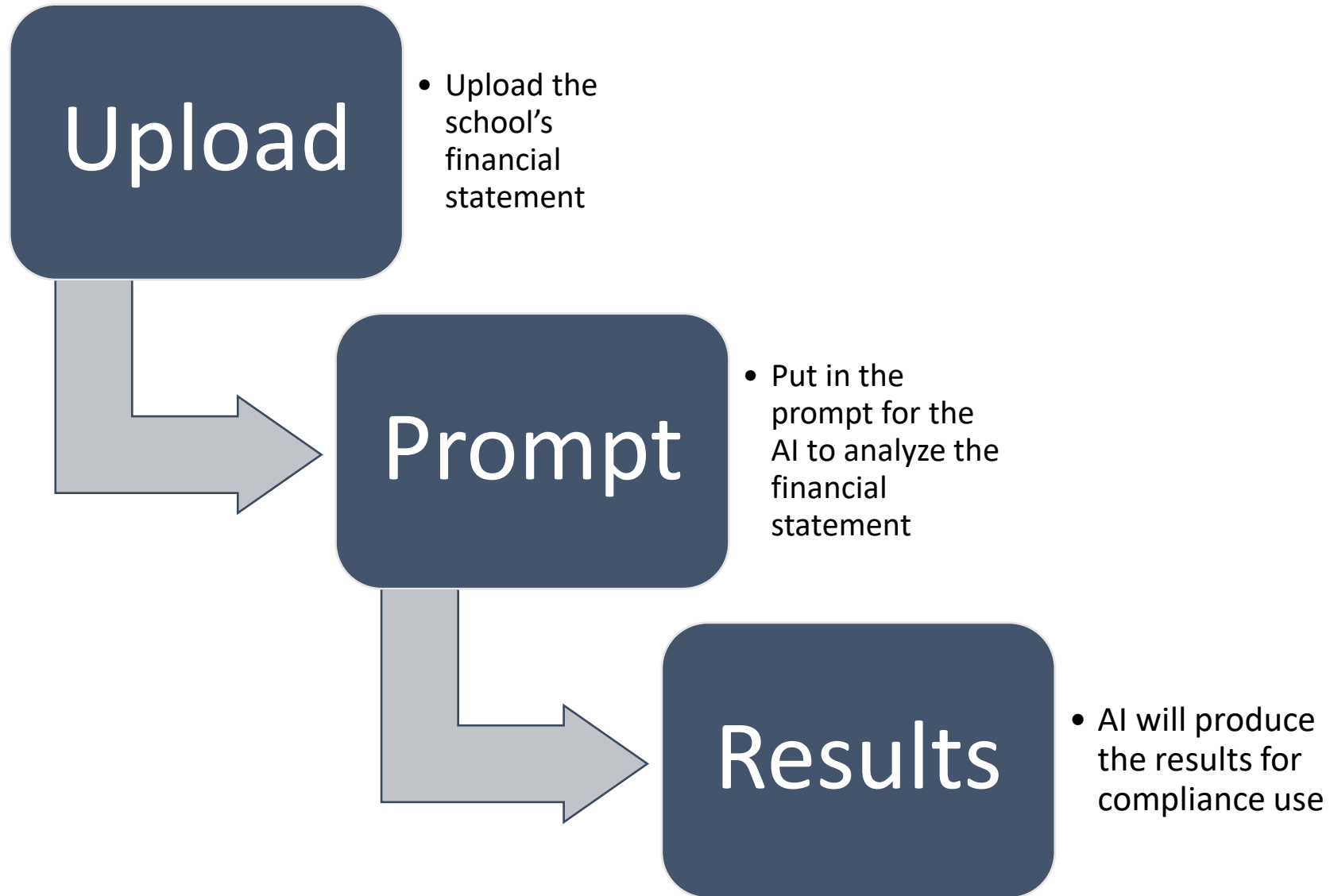
## Potential Impact on the Nonpublic Postsecondary Education Commission (NPEC)

The bill directly involves the NPEC in approving postsecondary educational institutions that provide trichology training courses. This means the NPEC will have a role in ensuring that these institutions meet the standards required for trichology training. The NPEC's responsibilities will expand to include oversight of these specific training programs, which could involve additional administrative tasks and regulatory duties.

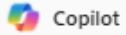

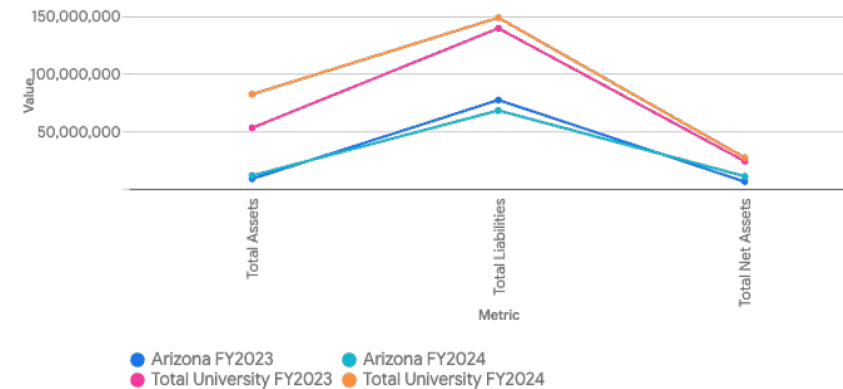
## Comparing Two Financial Documents

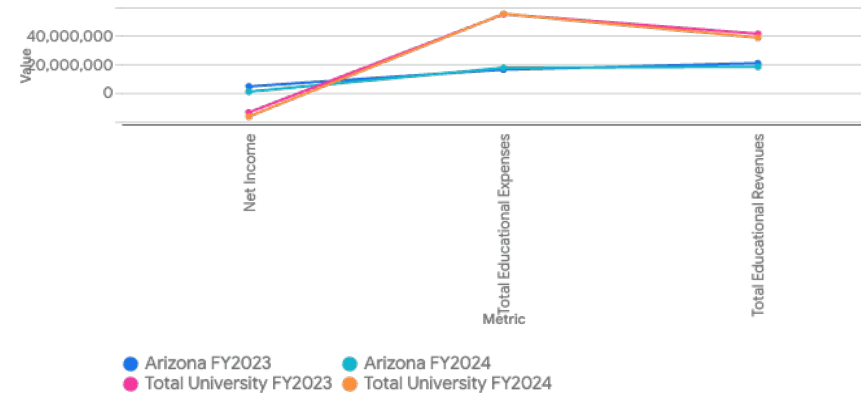

Balance Sheet Trends



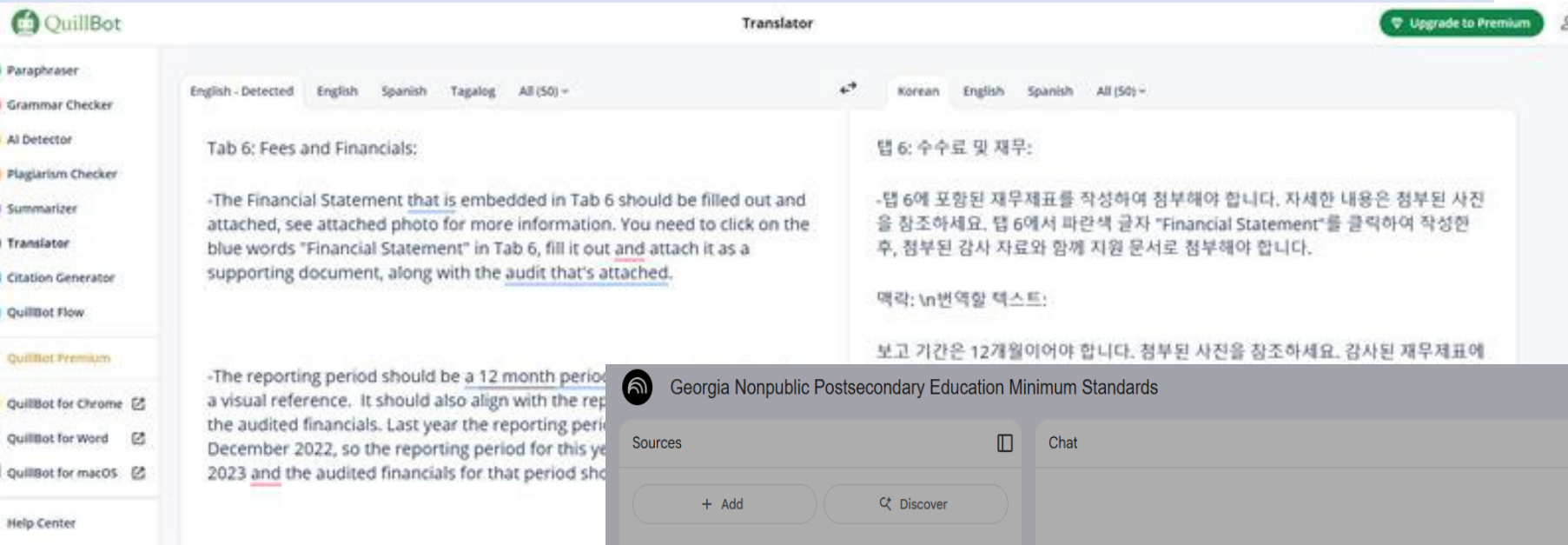
Income Statement Trends

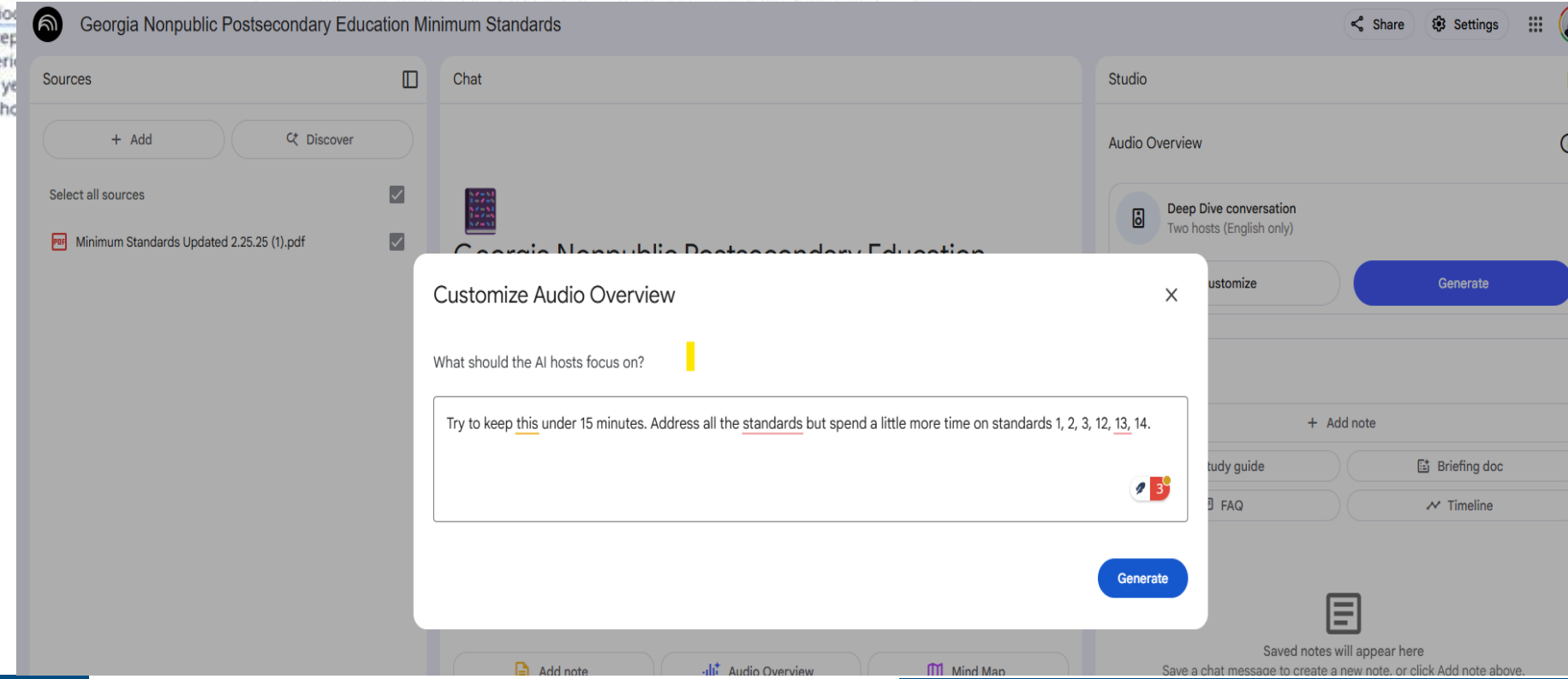

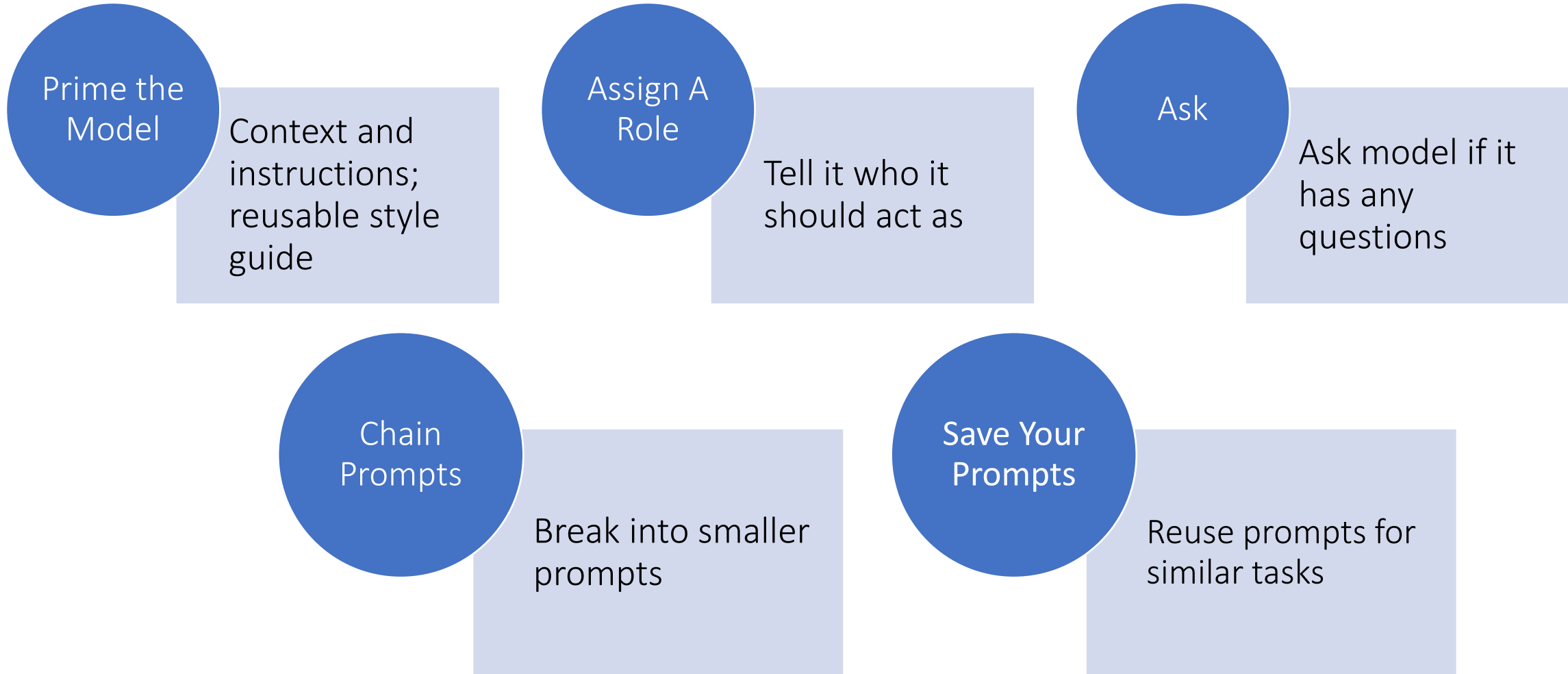
