

Call for Conference Presentation Proposals Submission deadline: November 16, 2018

The National Association of State Administrators and Supervisors of Private Schools (NASASPS) invites you to submit a proposal to present at its 2019 Annual Conference, which will be held April 14-17, 2019 in Jacksonville, Florida.

The conference will include both submitted and invited presentations. Conference participants include professionals from state and federal regulatory agencies, degree and non-degree granting private postsecondary institutions, national and regional accrediting agencies, state guarantee agencies, lenders, and other interested parties.

Presentations are generally 60 minutes in length. They may be led by a single presenter or a moderated panel. Previously presented topics can be found on the NASASPS website at <u>www.nasasps.org</u>. While all presentation topics are encouraged and accepted, NASASPS has received requests for more information on the following:

- Data Collection- what are states collecting from schools, how are they collecting it, and what are the specific outcomes they are measuring?
- Sureties vs. STRF best practices and how to determine acceptable amounts
- School closures: What are proactive measures state agencies and other entities can take when a school closure is announced?
- Proposed or current federal regulations and their impact on state regulatory agencies
- Bankruptcy laws and impact during closures
- Processing complaints against authorized institutions
- International schools, visa mills or foreign schools wanting a US presence
- Effectively communicating with external constituents and board members
- Interactions between state professional boards for program approval and state higher education agencies that give institutional approval
- Data Protection and Privacy including GDPR as it relates to post-secondary institutions.
- Notifications and Disclosures How to manage SARA notification requirements for informing students about professional board requirements related to the students' out-ofstate activities
- State Authorization Federal Regulations delays, lawsuits, and negotiated rulemaking: what should institutions be doing to remain in compliance for out-of-state activities
- How to address the proliferation of new unaccredited providers offering credentials (on their own or in partnership with institutions) that claim they are not subject to state oversight
- Administrative Law for Regulatory Agencies: practical knowledge of the regulatory legal process, the role of the state regulator and general counsel, adjudication, and litigation

Presenters are strongly encouraged to provide resources and/or reference materials attendees can take home with them or attain through electronic means. Please note that presenters and panelists are eligible to receive a \$50 discount on their conference registration fee.
