In 2019, the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board (THECB) began requiring a surety instrument for every degree-granting institution under a Certificate of Authorization (THECB-recognized accreditation) or a Certificate of Authority (seeking THECB-recognized accreditation). The surety has to equal one term's tuition and fees, plus a small administrative amount. This has resulted in rather large sureties for institutions with a large number of students in Texas. We are assessing whether we should cap the amount.

THECB is now preparing rules that will cover the procedure for our agency to collect on a surety if an institution closes during a term so that we can return tuition and fees to students for the last term. Any assistance with forms for students to apply for return of funds would be very helpful.

Our closed school student transcript repository continues to gather documents. It has been slow on getting the technology piece finalized and bugs worked out, but we hope to have all records in our possession in the repository by the end of the year. We will then seek records from other sources.

MS updated regulations for FY2020.

1. With closure becoming common place, CPSCR has made changes to requirements from institutions in event of an announced closure process and procedure to include providing the state with more information on students than previously required. Upon announcement of closure, CPSCR will immediately issue an temporary certificate of registration for the institution. This allows additional monitoring of the institution.

2. CPSCR will begin charging a small fee for institutions applying for exemptions from registration.

3. Statutory changes to the use of the surety bonds can no be used to pay administrative costs in the event of closure. The Commission approved a new calculation on surety bonds. All institutions will have a minimum bond of \$50k. Upon reporting Gross Annual Tuition each year, the bond requirement will be reviewed by CPSCR. Institutions reporting GAT figures of \$ 1 mill or better, will be required to obtain an increased surety bond based on their reported amounts. The bonds will max out at \$200k for institutions reporting over \$5 mil in a fiscal year.

With the addition of the EDvera system for our online registration in MS, I have hopes of opening up more available time to do more school visits and maintain a better assessment of the schools registered in MS.

Per HB 181 <https://apps.legislature.ky.gov/record/19rs/hb181.html> , which became effective June 27, 2019:

Our agency, the Kentucky Council on Postsecondary Education (CPE), now licenses:

1. Non-profit institutions offering courses/programs at the bachelor's level or higher, in which case we license everything that the institution offers that is for college credit including below the bachelor's degree level.
2. For-profit institutions offering courses/programs at the bachelor's level or higher, in which case we license everything that the institution offers that is for college credit including below the bachelor's degree level.
3. Out-of-state public institutions operating or soliciting in KY per 13 KAR 1:020 and offering courses/programs for college credit.

The Kentucky Commission on Proprietary Education (KCPE) now licenses: Non-profit and for-profit institutions offering only below the bachelor's degree level.

Basically:

-- Prior to HB 181, neither CPE nor KCPE regulated non-profit institutions offering training programs not for college credit. KCPE regulated for-profit institutions offering training programs not for college credit. CPE only regulates courses/programs for college credit. But neither agency regulated non-profit institutions offering training programs not for college credit.

o So, per HB 181, KCPE now regulates non-profit institutions offering training programs not for college credit.

-- In addition, HB 181 moved the regulation of non-profits offering at the associate level and below from CPE to KCPE, and thus, the regulation of for-profits and non-profits in terms of the level of offering is now with the same state agency – KCPE now regulates both non-profits and for-profits offering at the associate degree level and below.

Legislative update-- Florida Commission for Independent Education is proposing legislation to authorize bonding for institutions unable to provide sufficient evidence of financial stability or institutions with programs on probation or subject to similar adverse action. The bond amount would have to be sufficient to cover the costs of completing the training of students, costs associated with storage and retrieval of student records should an institution close, and costs of on-site visits or evaluation teams associated with such closure. Florida currently has a Student Protection Fund which assists with costs associated with the closure of non-degree schools, but not degree granting institutions. There is no statutory bond requirement.

Rules update--Florida's administrative rules are being updated to reflect current practices in the areas of school closures and institutions licensed by means of accreditation (LBMA). Future rule revisions are planned in the area of distance education.

**Argosy Bond:** After the change of ownership in 2017, Argosy's two campuses in Georgia were required to start over on our 5-year bonding requirement. Argosy cancelled their bonds in January 2019 (our contract requires 30 days of notice to cancel), however, the surety sent the cancellation notice to an old address and we never received notice until we tried to cash in the bonds after Argosy's closure. Currently, our state's Attorney General's Office is in litigation to receive a full surrender of the two \$200,000 bonds. As supporting documentation for the AG, our agency conducting a survey of affected students who reported actual damages totaling over \$1 million. Per the AG—no other state is suing for this matter.

**Investigator Position:** Beginning on July 1st, our agency made changes in our structure, creating an Investigator position, mostly stemming from a diploma mill in the state that was finally shutdown this past Spring after years of trying. This position will be responsible for investigation potential problem institutions, all student complaints (this used to be divided between 6 staff members), all school closures, and potentially transcript requests (due to forthcoming budget cuts). The goal is to improve customer service by reducing turnaround times and streamlining our processes in these areas.

**Avocational Exemption:** With a new governor who took office in January, one of his priorities is to reduce regulatory burdens. Our agency is currently working to redefine our internal procedures for how we interpret and enforce the section of our code that allows for avocational exemptions (meaning the school does not have to go through our authorization process). One area of change we are proposing is for bartending schools. By redefining avocational as a program that, for example, is under 40 clock hours, costs less than \$1,000, and does not necessarily lead to a job (loosely interpreted), bartending schools fall into this category. Given the low stakes of this deregulation, this allows us to be able to comply with the governor's directives, reduce the burden on these schools, and allow our agency to be able to focus our efforts in areas that have a greater impact on students. Per the AG, more work still needs to be done to determine how specific the policy should be

The Division of Private Occupational Schools (DPOS) is working with the Department to propose a legislative bill to require all DPOS schools to register on the Eligible Trainer Provider List (ETPL). The ETPL allows schools to be eligible for federal workforce funds and centralizes important information that can be used by DPOS and Colorado Department of Higher Education (and Colorado Department of Labor and Employment) to record and assess information critical to: enrollment, credential and degree completion, and matriculation into the workforce.

DPOS is continuing to review its processes for corporate structure analysis and financial stability. We have a number of schools who have questionable corporate structures and disclosures. Additionally, while we are finalizing our electronic financial form, we are continuing to receive information that makes it difficult to assess the financial stability of institutions. (One of the new rules will require that all financial submissions be CPA certified; once this is enacted, we will be ready to launch our new electronic form).

DPOS is in its rulemaking process to update and clarify all rules as well as to propose substantive modifications or additions. Currently we have an issue with a group lobbying for an exemption for massage therapy CE and have new inquires related to Pilates so we are attempting to propose a rule to create an "ancillary exemption" that is anchored to an existing statutory exemption (in order to preclude a further carve out for a subject matter exemption in statute).

DPOS has initiated a task force by reaching out to several state and federal agencies who are involved in some aspect of the truck driving industry with the purpose of working collectively to ensure that Colorado is on the leading edge of rolling out solutions to address training, safety and perhaps rules or legislation since the Federal guidelines for Entry Level Driver Training (ELDT) intended to mandate standards have been delayed until at least February of 2021.

DPOS is also working on Bond refunds for Ecotech students and CLE truckdriving college whose bond company is refusing to recompense students.

The in-state public and not-for-profit degree granting institutions in Iowa are authorized under an exemption from registration giving Iowa College Aid limited authority to require the implementation of policies and procedures pertaining to sexual abuse, substance abuse, child abuse and military refund policy.

The agency is also authorizing non-degree in-state vocational institutions to a limited degree which includes financial protections.

Full licensure (registration) is confined to degree granting non-SARA institutions of all sectors, primarily out-of-state.

State of New Mexico Update:

The New Mexico private post-secondary schools division (PPSD) had been eliminated by former New Mexico Governor Martinez in December of 2016 and as a result, the entire PPSD staff was terminated. In May of 2018, a new PPSD director was hired to re-establish the division. In the following months, contracts were established with local storage companies and online service providers to not just ensure continuity of PPSD services, but to also provide more efficient PPSD services. The new vision was to convert all paper applications to online applications in order to make the Division more efficient and effective. In the fall of 2018, the mandatory annual reporting season for NM State Authorized institutions was entirely done online and thereafter, the PPSD division expanded the online services to State Authorization applications, exemption applications, institutional substantial change applications, transcript request applications and student complaint procedures. With the latest addition of an incredible new division staff member, the division is currently focusing on eliminating inconsistencies in State rules as well as establishing a new compliance matrix for future site visits to ensure that New Mexico State Authorized institutions are held accountable to the New Mexico Statute and state rules.

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
